

Guidelines for obtaining the One Health Certificate

Aim

The One Health Certificate is intended to help involve young scientists in the crosssectional activities of One Health research at an early stage and to contribute to the formation of an active One Health research community under the umbrella of the One Health Platform.

General conditions

Obtaining the certificate is mandatory for all doctoral students who are funded by projects under the umbrella of the Zoonoses Platform/One Health Platform.

In addition, all other doctoral students who are writing their doctoral thesis within the area of One Health and are members of the One Health Platform also have the opportunity to obtain the One Health certificate. The prerequisite is a declaration of intent from the project leader stating that the topic of the doctoral thesis is One Health-related and that the doctoral candidate's wish to obtain the One Health certificate is welcomed.

In addition, the following achievements must be proven:

I. At least the following number of events from the One Health Platform* program must be attended and/or actively contributed to:

1 x active contribution to one junior event of the Platform (Young One Health Forum or Spring School)

plus

2 x active contributions (Poster or Talk) to the One Health Symposium **plus**

1 x participation in a workshop of the One Health Platform **plus**

1 x Additional activity such as attending a specialist conference or a similar event format (training courses, workshops, etc.) outside the One Health Platform.

* The equivalent event formats of the Zoonoses Platform will also be recognized for a transitional period.

II. The doctorate must be completed with at least magna cum laude (for institutions with other assessment criteria, the equivalent applies). Proof of this must be provided by submitting the doctoral certificate.

All relevant documents must be handed in at the office site Greifswald - Insel Riems.
